




Today, the Holy City of Mecca sees between 2-3 million pilgrims every year during Hajj. Even during the time of the Prophet Muhamad (ﷺ), Mecca was a center for trade and travel. However, this wasn't always the case. In the days of Ibrahim (AS), Mecca was an empty desert valley devoid of life and, more importantly, water.

Presently, as millions of pilgrims drink from the well of Zamzam, we should remember the sacrifice and trial faced by Ismail (AS)

and his mother, Hajar. When Ibrahim (AS) told Hajar that it was Allah SWT who commanded that he leave his wife and child in the desert, Hajar said, "We are not going to be lost since Allah Who has commanded you is with us." ¹ As the mother of Ismail soon found herself in the desert with a child crying from thirst and no water to be seen, her Tawakkul in Allah was rewarded in the form of an angel digging his heel into the desert, causing the water of Zamzam to spring forth.

Although for many of us around the world, having water to drink seems like a mundane part of life, a devasting number of Muslims today, like Hajar in the desert, put their faith and reliance on the mercy of Allah SWT for the simple blessing of a glass of water.


Every sip of water that quenches the thirst, every bite of a fruit that fills the mouth with sweetness and every moment of relief from the heat that one finds while resting in the shade is a blessing that was only given to Hajar for her trust in Allah when all hope felt lost.

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BLESSINGS FROM BEYOND

As Muslims, our *Akhira* should always be at the forefront of our minds. What is love if not the concern we have for the *Akhira* of those we hold near and dear to our hearts? But this begs the question, what can we do for the *Akhira* of others? What can parents do for the *Akhira* of their children, and what can children do for the *Akhira* of their parents? We know from the words of the Holy Prophet (SAW) that while our good deeds come to an end upon death, there are ways in which we can continue to receive the reward of good deeds from beyond the grave. It was narrated by Abu Hurairah that the Messenger of Allah (SAW) said:

"WHEN A MAN DIES ALL HIS GOOD DEEDS COME TO AN END EXCEPT THREE: ONGOING CHARITY (SADAQAH JARIYAH), BENEFICIAL KNOWLEDGE AND A RIGHTEOUS SON WHO PRAYS FOR HIM."¹

So, how can we act upon the wisdom of Rasool Allah (SAW) from this hadith? For starters, we need to understand the three deeds mentioned in hadith and how we can implement them into our lives. Starting from the top, "Sadaqah Jariyah" is

a type of charity that continues to benefit the people, such as building a well or a masjid. The second deed mentioned in the hadith is "beneficial knowledge." In the context of the hadith mentioned above, beneficial knowledge can refer to knowledge which brings one closer to Allah, such as sharing a reminder from the Quran and Sunnah. Lastly, a "righteous son who prays for him" refers to our pious children who will continue to make dua for us even after we have returned to Allah.

Now that we understand the deeds mentioned in the hadith of Rasool Allah (SAW), we must take it upon ourselves to implement them in our lives. As for *Sadaqah Jariyah*, there are many opportunities to donate to the Al-Ansaar Islamic Foundation. However, the focus of this article is the last two deeds mentioned in the hadith. The "Full-Time Hifz Program" at Al-Ansaar helps parents give their children the opportunity to learn and share beneficial knowledge as they memorize the book of Allah. Furthermore, the Hifz Program will teach children proper Islamic etiquette, ensuring they grow into righteous believers who will pray for their parents. The "Full-Time Hifz Program" is a fully functional school for children aged grades k-12, accredited with Alberta Education covering all school subjects as well as memorization of the Holy Quran under the guidance of scholars and qualified teachers.





Hajj is a highly ritualistic act of worship, consisting of many symbolic rituals that hold great significance within Islam. Allah SWT brings attention to the sanctity of the month of Hajj, Dhul Hijjah, and the rituals of Hajj, saying, "O believers! Do not violate Allah's rituals of pilgrimage', the sacred months, the sacrificial animals, the 'offerings decorated with garlands, nor those 'pilgrims' on their way to the Sacred House seeking their Lord's bounty and pleasure." ¹ Aside from the important link it has with the legacies of Ibrahim AS and Ismail (AS), Hajj has an important connection to *Qiyama*, the Day of Resurrection, that we should reflect upon.

Consider the different rituals that one must perform for their Hajj to be accepted. Why are we supposed to enter the state of Ihram (ritual consecration), use two white cloths to cover ourselves, for men, and not wear any stitched clothing? Why must we not shave or pluck any hair, not trim nails, or put on any perfume or cologne until we leave the state of *lhram*? Why do we say "labayka Allahuma labayka" (I am here at Your service, oh Allah, I am here at Your service)? Why must we walk long distances for days to perform the various rituals required to complete Hajj?

Carefully considering these many stipulations, we should be able to draw similarities between Hajj and the events leading up to the beginning of the Judgement of Allah. It should remind us

of how we will be buried once we pass away and how we will be resurrected: wrapped in white cloths, resurrected bare and dishevelled, and clothed once again in white based upon our level of righteousness in this worldly life. It should remind us of how all of humanity will be gathered together in the Land of Gathering, the lands of Shaam (may Allah uplift the plight of our brothers and sisters there in Palestine), and all will be forced to heed the call to this land where the Judgement will take place and travel to it in various fashions, again, based on the level of piety one had in this life. It is as if Hajj is a rehearsal and a reminder for the Day of Judgement and Resurrection; the day on which each will know their final destination: Paradise or Hellfire.



In celebration of the blessed days of Hajj, Al-Ansaar Islamic Foundation hosted "All About Hajj," a special event focused on teaching children the importance of Hajj as a pillar of Islam. Children were taught about the history of the Ka'aba, the call to Hajj, Ihram, and Talbiyyah.

As Muslims living in the West, we must keep our children engaged with the deen in a way that will instill the values of Islam, along with the love of Allah and his Prophet (SAW), in their hearts. The month of Muharram is set to begin on the 7th of July, 2024. DID YOU KNOW?

According to a hadith Narrated by Abu Qatadah Al-Ansari, the Prophet of Allah (SAW) said that "fasting on the day of Ashura is an expiation for the preceding year."³ Fasting on the day of Ashura is a blessing in such a way that Allah forgives our minor sins from the previous year by simply observing this sunnah.
